2 About the Conference

The European Population Conference (EPC) is the main conference of the European Association for Population Studies (EAPS). It brings together researchers working in demography and population studies from around the world.

The 2026 edition takes place in **Bologna, Italy, from 3 to 6 June 2026.**

Conference Theme

Meeting New Realities

The conference addresses emerging demographic challenges, including global inequalities, climate change, migration dynamics, population ageing, and changing family behaviours.

The theme Meeting New Realities reflects the intent to explore how demographic research can respond to the major transformations reshaping our societies—from climate change to conflicts, from economic instability to the technological revolution, and to the new geopolitical landscape.

Rather than proposing “ideal” demographic models, EPC 2026 invites the scientific community and public decision-makers to understand and adapt to the emerging demographic equilibria, with the aim of anticipating the social, economic, and political consequences of these changes.

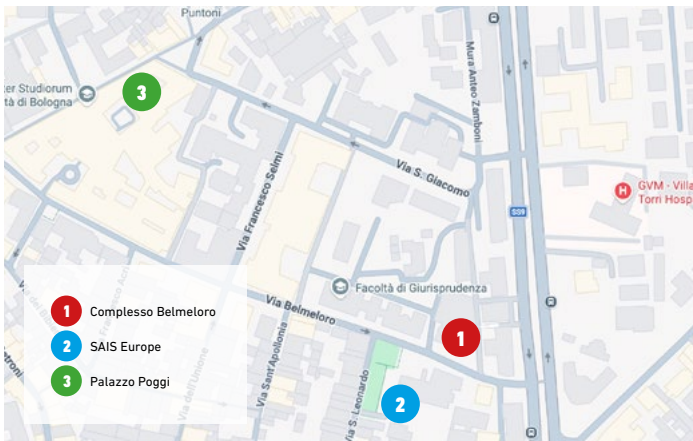

Arrival by Air

The nearest airport is **Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport (BLQ)**, located approximately 6km from the city centre.

From the Airport to Bologna Centrale Railway Station

Marconi Express

From the airport, participants can take the *Marconi Express*, an automated shuttle connecting Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport with Bologna Centrale railway station in approximately 8 minutes.

- Service operates daily from 05:40 to midnight
- Up to 8 departures per hour at peak times
- One-way ticket: €12.80

Tickets can be purchased at vending machines in the Marconi Express stations and at several points within the airport. The service can also be accessed using contactless payment (card or device) at the gates.
